World Championships Candidates 2024

The double round robin candidates tournament to determine challenger for world chess championship 2024 was held from April 3 to April 22, 2024 in the Great Hall, Toronto, Canada. The event was won by GM Gukesh D. from India who is now the youngest ever winner of the Candidates. Gukesh finished with 9 points out of 14 followed by GM Hikaru Nakamura and GM Ian Nepomniatchi who finished with 8.5 points each.

WEEKLY PUZZLE SOLVING/TRAINING SESSIONS

Taking into account the demands of players, weekly training sessions for players of the rating range 500-1500 is being planned for May term of iitm bs. The final schedule is to be released after the registrations for May term are over.

Women's Candidates 2024

GM Tan Zhongyi from China is the winner of womens candidates 2024. This was the 1st time women's candidates was held simultaneously at the same venue as the open category. GM elect R. Vaishali from India created a record by winning 5 straight games. She finished joint second with GM Koneru Humpy.

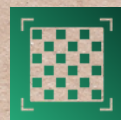


29th TePe Sigeman & Co Chess Tournament 2024

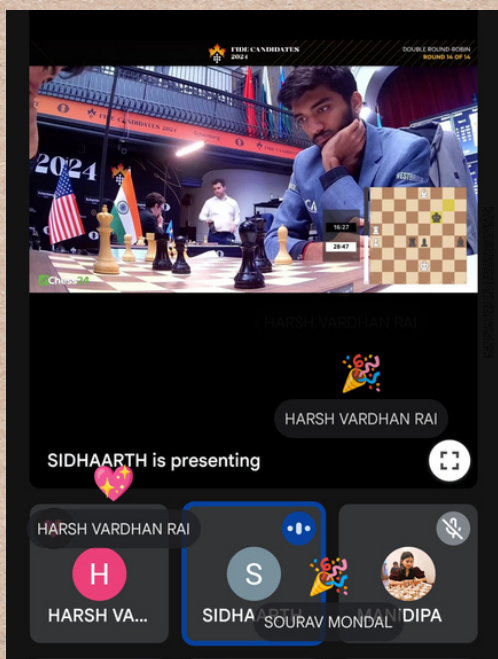

EVERY "SECOND" COUNTS



In the high-stakes arena of chess tournaments, every second counts. The pivotal role of seconds—trusted advisors and strategists—can make all the difference between victory and defeat. The Candidates Tournament 2024 exemplified this truth vividly.

R. Praggnanandhaa, the young prodigy, enlisted the expertise of Grandmaster Peter Svidler as his second. Their collaboration bore fruit as Praggnanandhaa dominated the opening stages of each game, showcasing the power of thorough preparation and insightful analysis. Svidler's guidance undoubtedly sharpened Praggnanandhaa's edge, proving the indispensability of a skilled second.

Similarly, Gukesh D., the eventual winner of the tournament, acknowledged the invaluable contribution of his second, GM Gajewski. Beyond mere technical advice, Gajewski provided crucial support on and off the board, bolstering Gukesh's confidence and strategic clarity.

These examples underscore the importance of seconds in the competitive chess landscape. Their role extends beyond mere analysis; they serve as mentors, confidants, and sources of inspiration. In the crucible of intense competition, the right second can provide the edge needed to outmaneuver opponents and clinch victory. In the chess arena, where every move is calculated and every decision decisive, seconds are the unsung heroes behind the scenes, shaping the destinies of champions.

IN THIS MONTH IN HISTORY

The inaugural Candidates Tournament was held in Budapest from April 11 to May 18, 1950. It was a double round-robin with ten contenders—Bronstein, Boleslavsky, Smyslov, Keres, Najdorf, Kotov, Stahlberg, Lilienthal, Szabo, and Flohr. The event in Budapest became the only Candidates Tournament to end in a tie for first place with no tiebreaker in place.

Bronstein and Boleslavsky had to play a playoff match held in Moscow in the summer of 1950. It ended in another tie, but Bronstein won the first decisive game and became the official Challenger. He drew a match with Botvinnik, who retained his title, as an equal score favoured the champion at the time.
