EVENTS IN JUNE IN INDIA AND WORLD

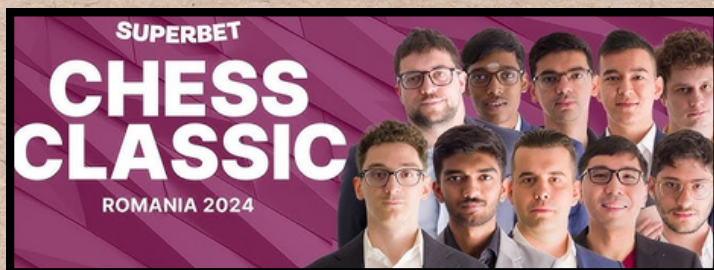
Magnus Carlsen wins Norway Chess

GM Carlsen finished at the 1st place in the prestigious Norway chess, dubbed as one of the strongest tournament of the calendar, by scoring 17.5 points. He was followed by GM Nakamura from USA (15.5) and GM Praggnanandha from India (14.5).



Arjun Erigaisi - The run continues

GM Arjun Erigaisi from India is now World no. 4 in classical ratings. After series of dominant performances in open tournaments, GM Erigaisi was able to cross 2770 and crossed GM Nepomniachi in the process.

INTER HOUSE CHESS CHAMPIONSHIP AT PARADOX 2024

The Shah-Maat inter house chess championship 2024 held from 30th May till 2nd June finished with a bang. Kanha house won the event after a series of dominant performances.

The event was inaugurated by Dronacharya award recipient GM RB Ramesh who shared his insights with the participants. It was followed by multiple round Blitz tournament, puzzle race and a chess quiz.

GM Akash Ganeshan joined the participants for the closing day and played a simultaneous exhibition with 10 top players of the tournament. Vignesh N of Namdhapa house defeated the grandmaster during the exhibition with the final score being 9-1.

FIDE'S WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP BID: FAIRNESS IN FUNDING AND ALLOCATION

FIDE's \$9.6 million budget for the World Championship has sparked debate over fairness in funding and their retention of operational funds. Chennai, New Delhi, and Singapore have submitted bids, highlighting global interest. While the bids have closed, concerns remain over transparency in fund allocation. FIDE's decision to keep a portion of funds for operations is common but necessitates sustainable distribution followed by public audit at the end of the tournament to ensure fair budget allocation for future. The challenge lies in balancing financial stewardship with inclusivity to uphold the championship's prestige and integrity.



IN THIS MONTH IN HISTORY

In the annals of chess history, June 23, 1883, marks a significant milestone with the conclusion of the London 1883 chess tournament. This historic event, held at the renowned London Chess Club, gathered the greatest chess minds of the era, including Wilhelm Steinitz, Johannes Zukertort, and others who vied for supremacy. The significance of this tournament can't be estimated in just words. This was the first instance for the use of the double-sided chess clock, invented and manufactured by Thomas Bright Wilson of Manchester Chess Club. In addition to that the tournament became a prelude to the Candidates tournament format for the future.

It was won convincingly by Johannes Zukertort (22 points out of 26) ahead of Wilhelm Steinitz (with 19 points). Remarkably, Zukertort was already assured of victory with three rounds to go, having scored an astonishing 22/23.

He then lost his last three games against relatively weak players, probably due to exhaustion. The tournament established Zukertort as rivalling Steinitz to claim to be the best player in the world and led to the World Chess Championship 1886 match between the two (the first official World Chess Championship match).

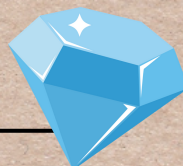
